

APPLICATION PROCESS FOR ALBERTA COURT OF JUSTICE CANDIDATES

EXPRESSION OF INTEREST AND ELIGIBILITY

- Qualified lawyers who wish to be considered for appointment as a judge should complete a Judicial Candidate Information Summary which provides the basic data for the subsequent assessment of, or comment on the candidature by the Judicial Council. Applicants should ensure this form is completed in full and in accordance with the instructions provided. All information received is treated confidentially.
- Applicants are required to have a minimum of 10 years at the Bar.
- No person other than a Canadian citizen may be appointed as a judge.
- Applicants are responsible for providing their criminal record/police information check.
 Those with an unpardoned criminal record will not be considered.
- Applicants will not be reimbursed for any expenses incurred in connection with their application or with the interview process.

JUDICIAL COUNCIL REVIEW

- Judicial Council consists of the Chief Justice of Alberta or designate, Chief Justice of the Court of King's Bench or designate, Chief Justice of the Court of Justice or designate, President of the Law Society of Alberta or designate, and two persons appointed by the Minister of Justice. Judicial Council is chaired by the Chief Justice of the Court of Justice. - Judicial Council contacts the Alberta Law Society as part of their reference check to ensure there are no outstanding insurance claims or complaints against the applicant.
- Judicial Council interviews the applicant. Following the interview, Judicial Council provides the Minister of Justice with its recommendation as to the suitability of the applicant.
- The Ministry of Justice will advise the applicant in writing as to the status of their application (i.e. recommended/not recommended at this time).

NOMINATING COMMITTEE

- An applicant, who has been approved by Judicial Council, must also be interviewed and recommended by the Nominating Committee <u>before</u> they can be deemed eligible for an appointment.
- The Nominating Committee consists of 11 members. It has representatives from the Court of Justice, the Law Society of Alberta, the Canadian Bar Association (Alberta Branch), other members from the legal profession, and public members. The names of the eight members appointed by the Minister of Justice can be found at: https://www.alberta.ca/public-agency-list.cfm
- The Nominating Committee considers applicants on the basis of criteria such as integrity, professional excellence, community involvement, appropriate personal characteristics and representative of the population. The full criteria is set out on page 2 attached. The Nominating Committee will determine those applicants to be interviewed by them, and conduct interviews for the purposes of adding names to the Appointment Eligibility List. The Minister of Justice will select a name from the Appointment Eligibility List to fill a vacancy in the Court of Justice. A recommendation will be made to the Lieutenant Governor in Council and, if there is agreement, an Order in Council is issued appointing the new judge.

PROVINCIAL NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Criteria used to select and recommend candidates for appointment as a Justice to the Alberta Court of Justice

Professional excellence

- A high level of professional achievement in the area(s) of legal work in which the candidate has been engaged.
- Leadership involvement in professional activities that keep one up to date with changes in the law and in the administration of justice. Contribution to the profession such as through writing, instructing or effective change.
- An interest in or some aptitude for the administrative aspects of a judge's role.
- Good writing and communication skills.

Community awareness

- A commitment to public service.
- Awareness of and an interest in knowing more about the social problems that give rise to cases coming before the courts.
- Interest in methods of dispute resolution, alternatives to formal adjudication and in community resources available for participating in the disposition of cases.

Personal characteristics

- An ability to listen.
- Respect for the essential dignity of all persons regardless of their circumstances.
- Politeness and consideration for others.
- Moral courage and high ethics.
- An ability to make decisions on a timely basis.
- Patience.
- Punctuality and good regular work habits.
- A reputation for integrity and fairness.
- Compassion and empathy.
- An absence of pomposity and authoritarian tendencies.

Demographics

The provincial judiciary should be reasonably representative of the population it serves.
 This requires addressing any under-representation in the judicial complement of women, visible, cultural, and racial minorities and persons with a disability.
